


Why it Matters

- Students in grades 2-5 participate in our "Elementary School" Theatre program
- Students in grades 6-8 participate in our "Middle School" Theatre program
- Students in grades 9-12 participate in our "High School" Theatre program

Each Musical Theatre and Play class culminates in a fully produced performance. **All students are cast in a role and are encouraged, but never required, to perform.** Then they work together to put on the production.

A Note From The Director ...

"On behalf of the entire production team, I would like to thank you for supporting these wonderful children. Thank you for giving them this rich arts experience and for being here today to celebrate their growth, both as performers and as human beings.

In addition to the exceptional musical score of Oliver, its spirited melodies and clever lyrics, we have a story that is full of rather heavy topics. The cast has been very responsible with these themes; we have had many great discussions. The Dickens classic explores challenging aspects of life, such as; unintended pregnancy, orphaned children, labor trafficking of children, food insecurities, criminal activity as a result of failed systems, and codependent, abusive relationships. Fortunately, we have found moments in character development that may answer the "why" regarding choices and behaviors. We have seen ways that family is created and that people care for one another. And there is repentance, forgiveness, redemption and love. Pay close attention to the lyrics in Fagin's "streamof-consciousness" song, "Reviewing The Situation". He is ultimately tormented with his existence as a thief and his desire to be a good and decent man. Can we change?

At a rather low, crucial moment in the story, Oliver, desperate for a sense of belonging, sings, "Where Is Love?" I believe it is here, within these very walls of The Founder's Theatre, and all around us if we will see it and share it. This cast has shown great empathy for these characters as well as each other. We are so very proud of them."






